## THANKS BE TO GOD

Giving from the Heart **BECAUSE GOD TAKES CARE OF US** 

1 KGS 17:10-16; HEB 9:24-28; MK 12:38-44

Today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, as well as the Gospel passage from Mark, both center on the actions of two poor widows. The Gospel passage is often called the story of the "Widow's Mite." But taken together, perhaps a more fitting title of the stories of these two ladies would be, "The Mighty Widows."

In our First Reading, the prophet Elijah encounters a widow during a terrible famine. She is preparing to make one last meal for herself and her son before their supply of food runs out. Elijah, acting as God's messenger, tells her not to be afraid and asks her to give him something to eat before preparing a meal for herself and her son. In an extraordinary act of trust — and radical hospitality — she agrees to Elijah's request! Again, speaking as God's own messenger, Elijah assures her of God's special provision for her, telling her that her "jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth." Sure enough, the widow and her son were able to eat for a year, just as God promised.

In the Gospel, Jesus observes the crowd as they make their offerings to the synagogue treasury. He sees the wealthy people putting in large sums, while a poor widow contributes only two small coins. The widow who has made the most pleasing offering. Unlike the rich, who gave a portion of their surplus, the widow gave all she had, "her whole livelihood."



In the eyes of the world, particularly in Biblical times, these widows were weak and dependent on others to take care of them. They each found themselves in desperate situations — one during famine with a child to care for, and the other clearly impoverished. Yet each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them. From where did this strength come?

It came from knowing who they are, and Whose they are. They had no need to panic amid natural disaster or cling desperately to their menial resources. Their faith in God set them free to trust Him when all seemed hopeless. Their faith kept them detached from material possessions. Their faith allowed them to be brave and respond generously and gratefully to God and to others.

These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the resources God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had. And acting as stewards made them gracious, generous, and mighty indeed.

## COVENANT RENEW WEEKEND 2025 SACRIFICIAL GIVING – THANK YOU!

We, as a parish, take the next few weeks to reflect upon the personal gifts we each have received as well as God's invitation to a life of stewardship. Our Sacrificial Giving 2025 theme is "Thanks Be to God", and our focus is on renewing our spiritual commitment to place God first and foremost in our lives through prayer, participation through service, and sacrifice by taking a step in giving to support His Church today and into the future.

To make our collective statement of faith, we have deemed the second and third weekends of this month "Covenant Weekends", trusting that each will respond with the fullest commitment. Your new commitment will begin in January 2025.

Our parish goal is 100 percent participation, each pledging what they can, for every gift matters to reach the parish goal of \$2.6million in giving in an act of faith to support the parish.

What happens on covenant weekends will set the course of all the ministries and services at St. Mary Magdalen – an investment for next year and beyond. As we explore stewardship and the many reasons we have to proclaim Thanks Be To God throughout the month of November, we are asking you to complete three important steps:



**PRAY:** In your personal prayer and family prayer, offer thanks to God for the blessings you receive each day and ask the Lord to guide you in the ways of stewardship. As well, pray for our parish.



**PLAN & PRIORITIZE:** Assess your personal priorities and plan your giving for 2025. This could be a good discussion to have with your family. Our request is that our parish families, each to their own ability, take a step toward the goal of their biblical tithe – 10% (half to the parish in the regular Sunday offertory and half to other charities you wish to support in the community).



**RENEW FOR 2025:** Our annual Sacrificial Giving Covenant weekends are November 9–10 and November 16–17. Your 2025 pledge card and guide are available at church or the parish office – and you can renew your covenant on the parish website (<u>www.StMaryMagdalen.org</u>) I ask that you take a step in faith to support our ministries, school and early learning center – all we do as a parish to make disciples as we live our mission to Share Christ with the World.

And for our SMMCS and ELC families, this is a key step in being a Partner in the Mission, renewing your relationship with the parish as we collaborate to provide excellence in Catholic education, childhood development and care at St. Mary Magdalen Catholic School and Early Learning Center for all our families.



## OUR PARISH SACRIFICIAL GOALS FOR 2025

**Encourage 100% participation** by asking our 2600+ families to return a commitment pledge card so we can plan for ministry and outreach in the year ahead.



Encourage families to give progressively, taking a step in generosity from 2024. We return to the Lord with increase in gratitude!

**Encourage families to sacrificially give** a combined \$2.6 million for regular Sunday & Holy Day offerings for the calendar year 2025.

# WHAT IS Sacrificial Giving?

Sacrificial Giving begins with the recognition that everything we have has been given to us by God and is based on an understanding that as Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

- · The Word of God generously shared in Scripture;
- The intercession of the Saints;
- The ministry of priests and deacons, the holy women and men in religious orders, and countless lay people who use their gifts to proclaim the Gospel, to teach our children and to serve the poor and vulnerable among us.

In a challenging world, gratitude is life changing and life sustaining. It lifts our spirits and calls attention to the blessings we have received.

#### **ROLES OF STEWARDS OF THE CHURCH**

Stewards of God's gifts are not passive beneficiaries. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church to participate in carrying out its mission:

- Parents, who nurture their children in the light of faith;
- Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;
- All Catholics, who give generous support—time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church.

### YOUTH STEWARDSHIP FOR EVERY GENERATION

Every Sunday we place at the altar a basket and ask our youngsters to bring forth their stewardship envelopes. This provides them a way to share how they use their gifts from God – good deeds, prayers, any number of ways they offer their time, talent and yes, their treasure!

Teaching to give at a young age helps start children on a path of giving that has the potential to last a lifetime. Over time, through conversations, modeling, and practicing stewardship, youth gain a better understanding of why stewardship is important and how it impacts them spiritually as well.

## FIN DE SEMANA DE RENOVACIÓN DE LA ALIANZA 2025 DONACIONES SACRIFICIALES - ¡GRACIAS!

Nosotros como parroquia, dedicamos las próximas semanas a reflexionar sobre los dones personales que cada uno de nosotros ha recibido, así como sobre la invitación de Dios a una vida de corresponsabilidad. Nuestro tema de Donaciones Sacrificiales 2025 es "Demos gracias a Dios", y nuestro enfoque está en renovar nuestro compromiso espiritual de poner a Dios en primer lugar en nuestras vidas a través de la oración, la participación a través del servicio y el sacrificio, dando un paso para dar y apoyar a Su Iglesia hoy y en el futuro.

Para hacer nuestra declaración colectiva de fe, hemos considerado el segundo y tercer fin de semana de este mes como "Fines de semana de la Alianza", confiando en que cada uno responderá con el compromiso más pleno. Su nuevo compromiso comenzará en enero del 2025.

Lo que suceda durante los fines de semana de la alianza determinará el rumbo de todos los ministerios y servicios en "St. Mary Magdalen", una inversión para el próximo año y más allá. 


## SCHOOL NEWS
